Nick ended up in the Women's and Children's Hospital after severe bleeding in his brain, but he has made an amazing recovery.

"We think the bleed was triggered when

Nick sneezed in the shower. He started screaming in pain from a terrible headache, before collapsing and falling unconscious," Mrs Evans said.

"When we got to the WCH we were told that Nick would be lucky to

make it through the next 48 hours - he wasn't meant to live."

His family is extremely grateful to the WCH for delivering him back to them.
